Here is some info on how to store your bike for the winter, I hope you find it useful:

As the days shorten and a chill whispers through the air, it is time to tenderly prepare your motorcycle for its winter hibernation. - Chain: Regular lubrication of the chain is essential to maintain its flexibility and prevent rust, ensuring smooth transmission of power from the engine to the wheels.
- Operating cables: Lubricating the operating cables helps to preserve their smooth movement and responsiveness, critical for controlling the motorcycle's functions.
- Clutch: Proper lubrication of the clutch mechanism ensures smooth engagement and disengagement, crucial for effective gear shifting.
- Gear change assemblies: Keeping the gear change assemblies lubricated is key to achieving seamless gear transitions and maintaining the longevity of the gearbox.
- Brake lever pins: Lubricating the brake lever pins is important for maintaining the smooth operation of the brake levers, ensuring reliable and responsive braking performance.

These are the lifelines of your motorcycle's operation. 
